MINUTES OF THE MEETING ON 21ST JULY 2021 AT 7.30PM AT THE CRICKET CLUB

1. Apologies – Cllr. Hawkins

3. Matters arising
 - a. It was noted that the war memorial refurbishment grant of £1,200 had been received
 - b. A reminder that the Disclosable Pecuniary Interest (DPI) forms must be sent to GCC by Friday 23rd July 2021
 - c. It was suggested that a defibrillator meeting might be arranged for October 2021
